- 4 Your Troop should develop a budget, incorporating dues, family partnership rebates, and goals for rebates earned in the Mags&Munchies and Cookie Programs.

Placement Request Information

Who Can Participate in an Event or Program?

Program opportunities in *Possibilities* are offered for registered Girl Scouts in Nassau County. All registered Girl Scouts can participate in level appropriate events and programs listed in this guide either as an individual, or as a member of a Troop. Registered Girl Scouts can attend any events with a non-registered participant. Non-registered participants would need to include the \$30 Girl Scout membership fee along with the program registration fee. Girl Scouts from other Councils may attend GSNC events for an additional \$5 fee per girl (space permitting). *Placement in programs/events/trainings is on a first-come, first-served basis*.

Individual Girls

It is the *parent/guardian's* responsibility to ensure proper adult supervision to all programs. GSNC will provide proper supervision for all GSNC run programs.

Troops

A Troop attends with chaperoning adults meeting ratio and Safety Activity Checkpoints. At drop off events, GSNC will provide appropriate supervision. A permission form will be needed for each girl.

Tag-Alongs

See individual program listings to determine if Tag-Alongs are permitted and if there is a Tag-Along fee associated with the program.

How to Request Placement for GSNC Programs

You are NOT "registered" until you receive a confirmation letter. Credit cards will NOT be charged unless placed in program.

Payment

Payment must be made at the time of registration. Fees may be paid with the following types of payment:

- ► Cash (With paper registrations turned in to Service Center only)
- ► Checks or Troop Checks (Payable to Girl Scouts of Nassau County)
- ▶ Credit Cards (MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover) Credit cards will ONLY be charged when placement occurs
- ► Cookie Credits (see below)

Cookie Credits

Earned by individual girls who sell 300 or more boxes of Cookies. Cookie Credits can be used for all GSNC Council activities listed in this book.

To Redeem Cookie Credit Gift Cards

Individuals may fill out the requested information on the Individual Girl Scout Program Registration Form. Or you may attach the Cookie Credit Redemption Form downloadable at www.gsnc.org/forms/documents/CookieCreditRedemption-Form.pdf with your program registration.

If placement in a program does not occur and you paid in cash or with a check your payment will be returned.

Refunds

- ▶ Once placed, placement request fees are not refundable unless Girl Scouts of Nassau County cancels the program.
- ► Refunds are not available for no-shows, late arrivals or early departures. Unless specifically stated in the listing, patches or badges are not provided at the event/program.

Confirmation Email/Letter

Once you are placed in the event, you will receive a confirmation via e-mail or regular mail within 7 business days. *Please wait for* your confirmation to arrive before calling with questions.

How to Register for Non-Council Programs

- ► Contact the person listed in the advertisement in order to arrange your program.
- Payment, refund, and registration procedures may differ for different providers. It is the Troop Leader's responsibility to be aware of these policies.
- ► Please have an idea of the dates/times you prefer and of the number of girls/adults in your group when you call.


The winning design of the Design a House contest will be featured in the GSNC OnLine Community, and will be available for everyone in the community to call home. See the rules below, and start designing!

HOW TO DESIGN AN ONLINE COMMUNITY HOUSE

Design an OnLine Community (OLC) Video Game Contest

Did you know that you can be a game designer? The GSNC's Design an Online Game Contest, wants you to create your own online game for everybody to play on the OnLine Community. It's easy, every game has a story, and we want to hear your story for a game. To be a game designer follow the directions below, draw us a picture, and tell us the story of your game, and we'll do the rest. You can create any kind of game, just make sure that it's one that you think others would have fun playing. Have fun creating!

WHAT TO SUBMIT FOR A ONLINE COMMUNITY GAME IDEA!

- 1. Come up with an idea. Is your game a board game? Is it a side-scrolling game? Do you pop bubbles to win points, or is it a maze? Decide what kind of game you're designing and tell us the object of the game. In other words: how do you win? Also be sure to tell us how you think you might control the game using the computer. Do you use the mouse to click and drag pieces into place? Or maybe you use the spacebar to make a character jump or the arrow keys to move a game piece from side to side. Tell us all of this in a
- typed document and submit it with a scanned hand drawing of your idea.
- 2. Draw a picture for us! Show us what your game will look like. It has to be clear to the judges what sort of game it is, and how it is played. Create a basic drawing of how the game screen will look. Include sketches of any characters that are involved and be sure to point out if you have points displayed on the game, or if you get extra lives. Here are some examples of some clear game illustrations and descriptions.



Illustration A is a maze game called A-Maze-ing Gamel! It has only one start and finish and is played by moving the arrow keys in any of the four directions. The object of the game is to get from the beginning of the maze to the end of the maze without choosing any wrong paths. A colored trail will show up in the maze behind you wherever you move to show where you are in the maze. You can only go forward in the maze, never back in a direction that you've already come from. If you fail the maze you must start again at the beginning of the level. Once a level is completed, you get to do a new, more complicated maze. There are a total of 100 levels.



Illustration B is a jumpinggame called Albert's Allowance. The character's name is Albert and he has lost all of his allowance money and wants to get it back! When the game begins your character automatically begins jumping and you must use the left and right arrow keys to land on new platforms and climb higher and higher, collecting as many coins as you can on the way. If Albert does not land on a platform when he jumps, he will fall down and you get a "Game Over." You have 3 lives each time you play. The object of the game is to get as many coins as you can to earn back Albert's allowance.



Illustration C is a side scrolling game called Adventure Time. You are a world traveler. Your character is running from the left of the screen to the right. As you run, you encounter obstacles that you must hit the spacebar to jump and avoid! You will also encounter helpful gear like water bottles and granola bars which will give you aboost of energy (you can jump higher) or extra lives! As you run and collect items, you gain points. With every 1000 points the background and terrain change because you are traveling to a new part of the world. There are? I evelsi in the game: one for each continent. The object of the game is to explore them all!



Illustration D is a puzzle game called Puzzle Challenge. This is a game where you can challenge a friend to see who can put together a puzzle the fastest. You each begin the game with the same number of scrambled puzzle pieces and whoever completes their puzzle first wins! This game can be modified for more experienced players to play with beginners (if you choose the beginner setting you will have only for 10 pieces in your puzzle whereas an expert might have 25 or even 50). This way players of all ages can play the game together.
